

The January Day by Day has readings up to the 17<sup>th</sup> February. The next issue will be one that covers all of Lent. This has not arrived yet but will come before mid-February.

## **Next Sunday**

Is the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time. In the gospel Jesus tells his disciples that they are the salt of the earth and the light of the world.

## **Pupils at the vigil Mass**

Next weekend the Stonyhurst boarders will be attending the 5.30pm Saturday vigil Mass. The Mass will be a "Youth Mass" with music more suited to young people. Next Sunday the 11am Mass will be a quiet one.

## **Day of prayer for victims of trafficking**

Next Sunday is the day of prayer for those who are still being taken and forced into work they would rather not do. Next Sunday is also the feast of St Josephine Bakhita – patron saint of trafficked women.

## **St Josephine Bakhita**

Was a slave from Sudan. She was enslaved when she was 7 or 8 years old – so young that did not remember her own name. She was called Bakhita by her enslavers (it means "fortunate" in Arabic). Eventually she was owned by the Italian Vice Consul who, on his return to Italy, brought her with him. In Venice she asked to become a Catholic and then entered the novitiate of the Canossian sisters. As a nun she spent the rest of her life as a "slave of Christ". She was canonised by pope John Paul II in 2000 and is the patron saint of trafficked women.
