As part of their *Every Step* campaign, Caritas is holding a sponsored walk around Whalley on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> September. Check out their website for more details



# St Cuthbert

Wednesday is the feast of St Cuthbert (634 – 687) bishop of Lindisfarne who promoted the Celtic form of Christianity found on these isles before St Augustine of Canterbury. He was buried in Durham Cathedral and his tomb became a major centre of pilgrimage.

When Henry VIII wanted to discourage pilgrimages he had St Cuthbert dug up and his tomb destroyed. In his tomb was found the "St Cuthbert's Bible", actually a copy of St John's Gospel. It was smuggled out of the country and entrusted to the care of the Jesuits in St Omers. It is an important book as it is the oldest example of a bound book (with a spine) ever produced in England.

Sadly in the 1970s the spine was broken and the British Library offered to restore it.



They eventually purchased the book from the Jesuits in 2011 for £9 million. The money was used to restore a number of churches, including St Peter's here at Stonyhurst. We can remember St Cuthbert with gratitude on his feast day!
