
# **CAFOD** envelopes

# Coming to St Peter's for Mass:

Even as we come out of lockdown, it is important to stick to the following guidelines:

- + Do not come to church if you are unwell, self-Isolating, shielding or returning from a country where you have to quarantine
- + You should wear a face covering
- + Sanitise your hands on the way in and way out
- + Observe the one way system
- + Observe social distancing make sure there are 2 empty benches between you and anyone else in the Church and away from the centre aisle.
- + Any printed materials you touch (Newsletters etc) place in a bin or take home with you.
- + Observe social distancing as you come into church, as you come forward for communion and, very importantly as you leave the church. We have to assume that someone is carrying the virus and take precautions.

If you are driving, you will need to buzz security at the white gates.

# Why are bunny rabbits associated with Easter?

We can understand the significance of Easter Eggs: the chick emerging from the egg reminds us of Christ emerging from the tomb on Easter Sunday morning. But why rabbits? They were an ancient symbol of fertility, especially at this time of the year, when the new bunnies were born. In some cultures, it was a clothed rabbit that brought the decorated Easter eggs for the children (a bit like Santa at Christmas). After 6 weeks of fasting from meat, a rabbit provided a tasty meal for a poor family on Easter Sunday.
