

Cardinal Sean Brady (Armagh)

Both Cardinal Brady and Cardinal Fitzgerald are over 80, so they can take part in the discussions, but they do not have a vote.

Three of the four English cardinal have visited Stonyhurst in the past. We can pray for them as they decide who to vote for in the conclave. Watch for the white smoke!
