#### **Praying for Vocations to the Priesthood**

You will be aware of the need to pray for vocations to the priesthood. The Bishop of a Diocese is 'the Pastor of the people of God'; he is, if you like, the official priest, appointed by the Pope to do the work of the church in a given area. He cannot do this alone as there are, thankfully, too many people to minister to; he needs help, and those who help him in this way are called priests. Today, the Catholic Church in this country finds itself with a decreasing number of priests to help the Bishops. As Pope Francis has said, 'Vocations are born in prayer and only in prayer can they persevere and bear fruit.'

At the back of the Church you will find some fold-up orange pamphlets entitled 'What is God asking of me?' On seven 'pages' you will find a topic relating to vocations:

1 The Bishop 2 Family Life 3 Those Discerning their vocation 4 Seminarians and Deacons 5 Priests 6 Religious and Consecrated Life 7 Missionary Disciples

Each topic has been assigned a day of the week. Each topic is introduced with a brief saying of Pope Francis or a popular saint and then follows a short prayer.

A suggestion: Take a copy of the orange leaflet and say the short prayer for each of the days of the week. In this way, even if you are not called to the priesthood and religious life, your prayers may help and inspire others to do so.

Keep praying these prayers. Who knows? Perhaps the Lord will hear your prayers and help inspire many young men and women to become priests or religious in his service.
