The heavens were torn apart and the Spírít, líke a dove, descended on hím. On Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> January the Prime Minister announced a new national lockdown for England. However, churches are permitted to *remain open* for communal worship with Covid safe procedures in place. You are permitted to *leave your house* to attend public worship in church.

In the light of this we shall keep to our regular Mass schedule in St Peter's:

(At the moment it is unclear if we will have boarders attending the 11am Mass. If so, this Mass will *not* be open to parishioners.)

#### Weekday Masses

Take place on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday at 8am in St Peter's.

#### Coming to St Peter's for Mass:

Since the new strain of the virus is so virulent, we need to take extra care:

- + Do not come to church if you are unwell, self-Isolating, shielding or returning from a country where you have to quarantine
- + You should wear a face covering
- + Observe the one way system
- + Observe social distancing make sure there are
  2 metres between you and anyone else in the
  Church and away from the centre aisle.
- + Any printed materials you touch (Newsletters etc) place in a bin or take home with you.
- Observe social distancing as you come into church, as you come forward for communion and, very importantly as you leave the church. We have to assume that someone is carrying the virus and take precautions.

*If you are driving, you will need to buzz security at the white gates.* 

#### Those who are shielding:

Should **NOT** come to church. Many have found a Mass on-line that they can follow. If you would like a copy of the current newsletter and missalette, please let Fr Tim know.

#### This Sunday

Is the feast of the Baptism of the Lord and marks the end of the Christmas season. The gospel is Mark's account of the baptism of Jesus.

#### Next Sunday

Is the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time. After the Christmas season, we are back to green vestments. The gospel recounts how John the Baptist pointed out Jesus to his followers and some of them became his disciples.
