'Remembrance Sunday'

Today, Sunday, November 12th, is the day when we remember in gratitude, and pray for the repose of the souls of those who have given their lives in the two World Wars and subsequent conflicts defending our freedoms.

All are encouraged to attend the annual Remembrance Service at the Hurst Green War Memorial, assembling for the Parade at the Village Hall at 10.30am. The Service begins with the traditional two-minute silence at 11.00am.

Stonyhurst College Campus Security Arrangements

As from November 20th 2017, vehicular access to the Stonyhurst Campus, which incorporates St Peter's Church, will be controlled by automatic gates. These are to enhance the safety of the pupils and staff in the College and St Mary's Hall, preventing access of undesirable visitors and unnecessary traffic. This will affect all those attending St Peter's Church. As simply as possible here is the method by which access for weekend masses will operate.

All parishioners arriving by car for the Saturday Vigil Mass at 5.30pm and the 8.30am mass on Sunday mornings should enter the campus via the 'White Gates' on the main drive. These will be opened and allow access from 5.00pm to 5.40pm on Saturdays and on Sunday mornings from 8.00am until 8.40am. To exit after mass, the gates will open automatically to allow any vehicle out. In the event of the gates being closed on approach, a call-point near the gates enables an individual to contact College Security, who will arrange entry, if necessary. Please restrict your entering and exiting to the 'White Gates'.

For weekday masses, the gates will be open from

7.45am until 8.30am for pupils arriving so that access and exiting will not be affected. Special arrangements will be made for College vacation times.
