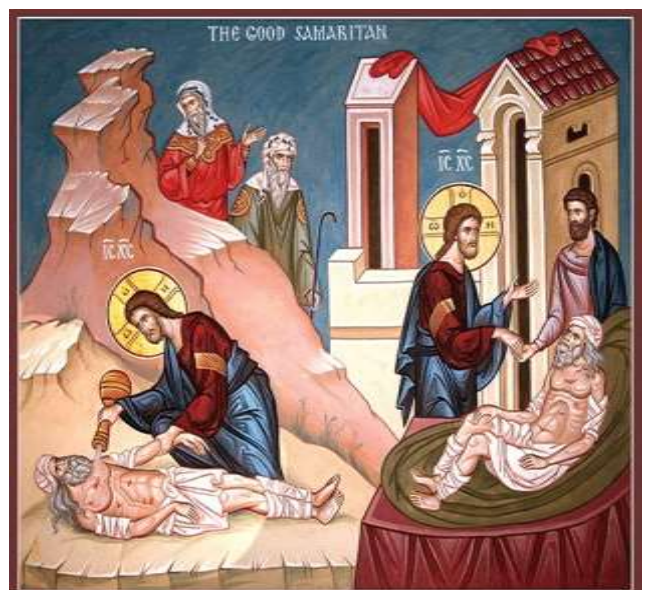

Thanks to everybody who attended the Midsummer Walk for our Deanery and for those who helped with planning it. The walk began with the *Hope in the Future* Prayer in front of the newly restored statue of Our Lady outside Stonyhurst College. It continued around the Tolkien Trail (all 6 miles) and included a picnic lunch beside the River Hodder. Walkers continued for as long as they wished and various opt-outs were offered. It was wonderful to get together in glorious and historic countryside, to strengthen existing friendships and to make new ones. Our Deanery stretches as far north as Dunsop Bridge, as far west as Lostock Hall, as far east as Clitheroe and as far south as Darwen. Forty-six people from eleven different parishes joined the walk.
