#### This Sunday

Is the 33<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time. In the gospel Jesus has a lesson for us on how to read the signs of the times.

#### **Remembrance Sunday**

This Sunday is also remembrance Sunday. The 5.30pm Mass will be exclusively for parishioners. Some students will be attending the 9.30 Mass, which, today will be in St Peter's. The 11am Mass is replaced by the Service of Remembrance in the village (see below).

#### The Remembrance Service in Hurst Green

This year we do not have permission to close the main road from Clitheroe to Longridge, so the arrangements for the service will be different from normal. We shall gather at 10.45am in the Memorial Hall carpark. The service of remembrance takes place there. After the service those laying wreaths will process to the Village Green via the back of St Peter's club. The wreath-bearers carrying them on behalf of different organisations will gather on the Village Green and then cross the road to the cenotaph to lay them. After the service refreshments will be available in the Memorial Hall.

#### **Rob Clare Memorial Service**

Takes place in St Peter's today at 4pm. As we remember him, we pray that he rest in peace.

#### **Next Sunday**

Is the feast of Christ the King. In the gospel Jesus admits to Pilate that he is the King of the Jews.

#### **Benediction next Saturday**

As there have been no cases of covid amongst the students for more than two weeks, they will return to Benediction next Saturday evening.

### Mass of thanksgiving for 1<sup>st</sup> Holy Communion

Takes place at 9.30am next Sunday morning. The Mass will be at St Joseph's, so we are expecting the chapel to be quite full.
