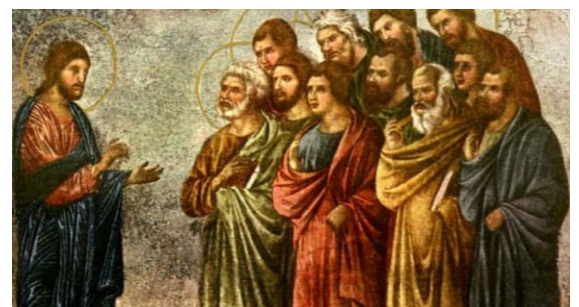

### **This Sunday**

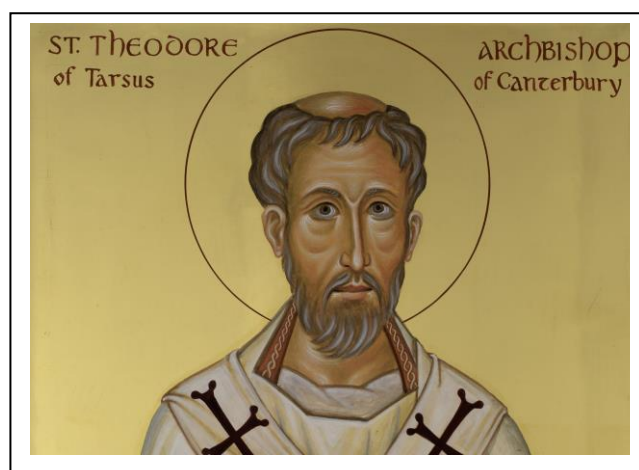
### **COP29 Petition**

### **St Theodore of Canterbury**



Like St Paul, Theodore was born in Tarsis. He was ordained a priest in the Eastern Orthodox rite. Theodore was sent by pope Vitalian to be the 8<sup>th</sup> Archbishop of Canterbury. He accepted this role as long as he could bring his scribe and confidant, Adrian, with him. He established a school at Canterbury. He is the patron of Theodore House.
