**Statistics**

We had 31 people come to pray in St Peter's on Saturday evening. For the 9.30am Sunday Mass, 250 pupils were watching in the college and 50 other people logged onto the Mass. The service at the Cenotaph was attended by 20 people, but watched by 211 online. Our newsletter was read by 144 people.

**The Cardinal on resuming Mass**

The Cardinal has criticised the government for not allowing Catholics for Mass. He said: "I think it will be changed. I think the evidence we've seen over the last couple of days is that this particular aspect of the decision by the Government is not supported by any scientific evidence and clearly shows a misunderstanding of the importance of religious faith."

Let's hope the Cardinal is right and that we can all come back to Mass soon!
