

Jesuit Parishes Meeting Report

Fr Tim writes:

The Jesuit parishes conference was both enjoyable and informative. 70 participants gathered from 8 Jesuit parishes. We were helped by Danny Curtin, our facilitator, Fr James Hanvey, a British Jesuit who helps Fr General in Rome, Fr Matthew Nunes of the Liverpool Archdiocese and Fr Peter Gallagher, the Jesuit Provincial.

We began with a look at Pope Leo's first official letter: *Delixi Te* where he reflects on God's love of the poor. Pope Leo identifies parishes as a place where the church can identify with, and accompany, those who struggle.

Danny helped us reflect on how we can become a parish of accompaniment where we listen to each other.

Fr James underpinned the theological dimension of parish life. A parish is where Catholics live out their belief in the Trinity.

Fr Matthew helped us to make concrete the Synod method. Having gone through 2 synods we now have a better sense of direction.

The meeting was very practical. Each parish identified ways in which it could become a place where we listen to God and respond to his invitations.

Finally, Fr Peter thanked parishes for their contribution to the life of the British Province and encouraged us to be places of discernment. As a result of the conference, we will have to review our own Parish Council and involve more people in reaching out to our youth.
