The Jesuit Pastoral Conference

.... is a tri-annual gathering of parish priests and representative laity from the various Jesuit-run parishes in Great Britain.

St Peter's, Stonyhurst (with St Joseph's) was represented by Fr Peter Griffiths, Andrew Snape, Francis Ahearne and Lucy and David Harrison.

The agenda of the Conference, which took place in the Conference Centre, The Hayes, in Swanwick, Derbyshire, was centered on the three documents issued by Pope Francis. Firstly, 'The Joy of the Gospel' which is about the missionary impulse behind the Church's ministry. Secondly, 'The Joy of Love' which concerns the Catholic understanding of marriage and family life. Thirdly, 'On care of our common home' which addresses the use and abuse by humanity of planet earth.

The methodology was simple. After a general introduction by Fr James Hanvey SJ, we separated into three groups. Two of us went to a study group on the first document, two to the second and one to the third. In these groups, we shared our reflections with the other representatives from all the other parishes who had similarly sub-divided their contingent so as to cover all three documents. Once we had come back together as a parish group, we drew up an 'action plan' with practical objectives for ourselves which will be posted in the Newsletter as the weeks go by. The parish will be facing significant challenges before the end of the year and we will all will need to reflect seriously on the suggestions that we have brought back from the Conference.

The celebration of mass on the two days of the Conference underlined the importance of prayer as we face the tasks that parish life calls us to attend to. Let us pray for one another in the days and weeks ahead. Fr Peter Griffiths SJ
