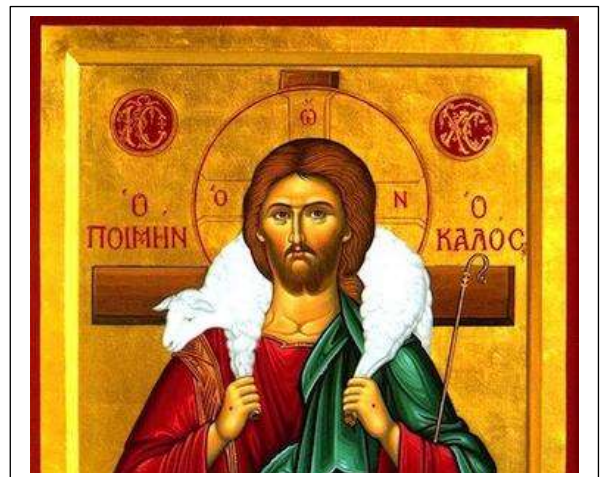
RSM Robert (Rob) Clare

From tomorrow we can begin to relax some of the covid restrictions that have been in place for over a year now. However, cases are still increasing in the area, so caution is needed. For example, it will no longer be against the law not to wear a face mask in church, but I hope everyone will continue to do so for their own protection.

For the summer vacation, the 11am Sunday Mass will be open to parishioners. This is a good option for those who wish to avoid crowds. There will be no livestreaming of Mass until September.

Usual Mass times are as follows:

Saturday

- 5.00pm** Church opens (with exposition)
- 5.15pm** Benediction
- 5.30pm** Mass in St Peter's

Sunday

- 9.00am** Church opens
- 9.30am** Mass in St Peter's
- 11.00am** Mass in St Peter's

Confessions will only be available on request.

Coming to St Peter's for Mass:

It is still important to adhere to the following guidelines:

- + Do not come to church if you are unwell, self-isolating, shielding or returning from a country where you have to quarantine
- + You should still wear a face covering
- + Sanitise your hands on the way in and way out
- + You may now enter and exit the church through either door. You will no longer be required to keep to the one-way system.
- + Be mindful of those who want to keep their distance and don't "invade" their space.
- + It is now safe to share printed materials, so you may return the missalette after use.
- + Observe social distancing as you come forward for communion.

If you are driving, you will need to buzz security at the white gates.

Using St Joseph's Chapel

Mass will restart in St Joseph's next Sunday morning. Chairs will be put out as people arrive, so that we can distance bubbles. Some may prefer to continue coming to St Peter's where there is more ventilation and more space.

This Sunday

Is the 16th Sunday of Ordinary Time. In the gospel today the 12 report back on their experience of preaching in the name of Jesus.

Weekday Masses

This week the usual times of weekday Masses are Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday at 8am in St Peter's. For the time being, weekday Masses will remain in the body of the church.
