Blood in Jewish tradition

At the time of Jesus and even today Jewish people do not eat blood or blood products. It was important that when an animal was killed for eating, all the blood would be drained from the animal first. This makes the food kosher or fit to eat.

At the time of Jesus people believed that blood contained the essence of life. Life was sacred, a gift from God. So to drink blood was to show disrespect to God.

The nations surrounding the land of Israel would drink the blood of their defeated enemies, but this practice appalled the Jews (and the Romans). Thus when the followers of Jesus heard that they must drink his blood they were dismayed. It was only at the Last Supper that we begin to understand Jesus' command to drink his blood.

It is the way in which the very life of God can enter our lives. What a privilege it is for us to be able to eat his body and drink his blood.
