RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults)

A new course will begin in September for those who wish to be baptised as Catholics or who wish be received into our church. If you, or someone you know would like to join the course, please let Fr Tim know. Baptisms and receptions usually take place at around Easter time.

Why do we call Mary Our Lady Queen?

On Tuesday we have the feast of Our Lady: "Our Lady Queen". In our church many of the feast days of Our Lady mirror feasts of Our Lord. We celebrate the birthday of Jesus on Christmas Day and the birthday of Our Lady on 8th September. 40 days after Easter we celebrate the Ascension of Jesus into heaven and last week we celebrated the feast of the Assumption of Mary into heaven. The last Sunday of the year is the feast of Christ the King and this Tuesday we celebrate the feast day of our Lady, Queen. The liturgical year is not trying to tell us that Mary is equal to Jesus by giving her these feasts. Rather we celebrate Mary as the first to enjoy the fullness of redemption through the saving grace of her son. Now in heaven, Jesus wants her to be honoured in the same way he is. Just as Jesus is not a King with an army to command and a country to run, so too Mary is not a Queen in the ordinary sense of the word. We call Jesus king because he demands our loyalty as his follower. Mary too is a followere of Jesus and an example to us of how to be a *perfect* follower of Jesus. In holding up Mary as an example, Jesus wants us to be perfect in the way she is. In holding her in high regard, we esteem the pathway we are called to follow.
