Blessed Miguel Pro

Tuesday is the feast day of the Jesuit Martyr, Blessed Miguel Pro. In the 1920's the government of Mexico was staunchly anti-Catholic and priests were banned from the country. It was because of this that Miguel decided that he wanted to be a priest and wanted to serve his countrymen. He joined the Jesuits and completed his studies in Europe. He had been a drama student, and this served him well when he returned to Mexico as he became a master of disguises. He had many brushes with the secret police and was nearly arrested on several occasions. Eventually the police tracked him down and he was executed without trial on 23rd November 1927, which happened to be the feast of Christ the King that year. As he knelt before the firing squad his last words were "Viva Cristo Rey!" – long live Christ the King. He was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1988, but so far he has not been canonized. He is a patron of drama students.
