IICSA (Independent inquiry in child sex abuse)

The report on the Catholic Church was published last week. It is 150 pages long and available on their website. It is not comfortable reading and points out many areas where we need to improve to make sure that all church activities are safe for our children and vulnerable adults. The report also stresses the need to listen to and help heal those who have suffered abuse in the past.
