Pope Leo's 1st Official Letter

Pope Leo has published his first official letter called: *Dilexi te* (I have loved you). Papal letters always take their name from the first two words of the letter.

Pope Leo begins by explaining that the poor have always been loved by God.

Pope Leo sees the love of Christ incarnated in love for the poor, caring for the sick, opposing slavery, defending women who experience exclusion and violence, making education universally available for all, accompanying migrants and charitable giving.
