## Eileen Hunt RIP

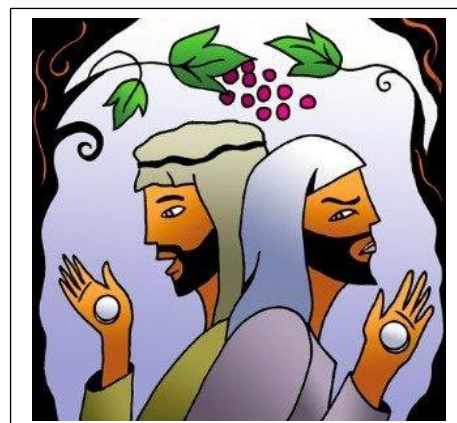
