

Female martyrs of the reformation

On Friday we celebrate the feast of three women who were martyred for the faith:



St Margaret Clitherow was crushed to death in York in 1586 for refusing to reveal secret hiding places for priests.

St Margaret Ward was executed at Tyburn in 1588 for helping a priest escape from prison.





St Anne Line was executed in 1601 at Tyburn for harbouring priests in her house. She helped the Jesuit John Gerard to escape from the Tower.
