
Our Lady of Manchester

Bomb Blast at Manchester Arena 22nd May 2017

It may be difficult to put into words what we feel when we hear about dreadful acts such as we heard about last Monday night, especially so close to home and possibly involving people we know and love dearly. It takes time to think our way through what has happened, and we need always to keep an element of prayer running through and informing our thoughts. In time, we may be able to introduce the theme of forgiveness. The good people of Manchester have set a wonderful example of love in return for hate and courage in the face of appalling adversity. Bishop Arnold was quick to respond with encouraging and supportive words expressed to you through your priests and recommending prayers for the victims, killed and injured, and for those who showed great generosity and courage at the scene. He recommends the prayers of the masses in a time of war or civil disturbance and for the preservation of peace and justice. I have printed these out on a sheet which you may wish to take away with you and use for your own private prayer.

I will offer the 8.00am mass on Friday, June 2nd for the repose of the souls of the victims of the attack and for the recovery of those who were injured.
