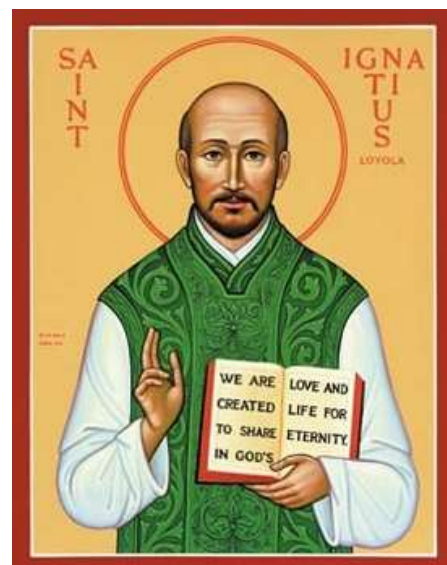

St Ignatius of Loyola

Ignatian prayer is imaginative, reflective, and personal. St. Ignatius of Loyola encouraged people to develop an intimate relationship with a God who loves them and desires only the best for them. Ignatius trusted human desires. He believed that our deepest desire is to return God’s love. Ignatius also trusted feelings. He believed that feelings of joy and sorrow, peace and distress, were important indicators of the path toward fruitful decisions and deeper union with God. At the heart of his prayer are the Spiritual Exercises and the Daily Examen. The Spiritual Exercises are a programme of meditations and contemplations to help us to really get to know Christ and be close to God. In the daily Examen we use the events of our day to show us where God is in our lives: how we can thank him, praise him, ask for forgiveness and make our petitions.
