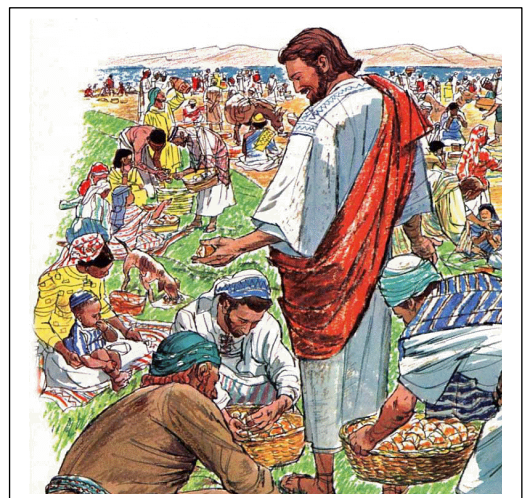

FIRE at ST Joseph's

Missio Red Boxes

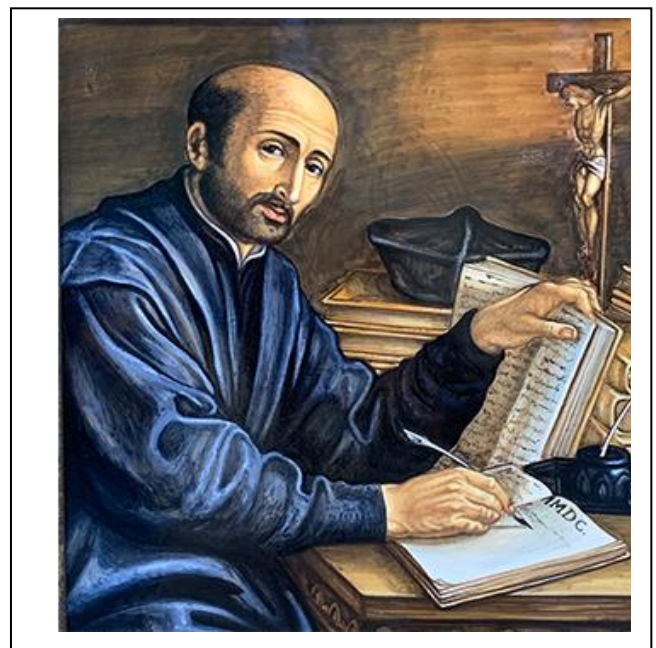
