Corona Virus Latest

The bishop has asked that all churches and chapels remain closed until further notice. We will no longer be able to keep St Peter's open for private prayer.

All public Masses are suspended until further notice.

Fr Tim says a private Mass each day. If you have an intention for one of these Masses, please let him know.

Fr Tim's availability

Each day Fr Tim will be in the Parish Office from 9am to 10am and available on the parish number (01254 826268).

At other times, leave a message on the parish answer machine, which will be responded too as soon as possible.

A daily prayer sheet is now available on-line. Lots of people have volunteered to help, so please contact Fr Tim if you need help with shopping, prescriptions, finding a buddy to phone everyday, or anything else!

Regular activities are suspended:

The Pope has asked that confessions be suspended, due to the risk to the priest and the penitent. Please make a sincere act of contrition. The 1st communion programme will resume in the Autumn.

The RCIA programme is almost completed, but it is not clear when our 6 candidates can be received into the church.

Baptisms will be postponed.

The housebound will not be able to receive communion during this period.

Marriages have to be postponed until after the crisis is over.

Funerals may take place but at the

graveside/crematorium only. A maximum of 10 people may attend.

Memorial Masses will be held after the crisis is over.

Other parish activities (Hope in the Future, Ignatian Habit, etc are all suspended)

Request delivery of Newsletter, reflections, copies of readings, bidding prayers (Thanks to those who have volunteered to deliver to every house in the village this week.) Some people will like to participate in Mass streamed over the internet. (Search "Mass – Live streaming") Our Jesuit church in Farm Street has begun to live-stream Mass (www.farmstreet.org.uk).

Fr Tim invites all parishioners to choose a "buddy". Phone your buddy every day. If they have a need you can't respond to, call Fr Tim. Pray for your buddy every day. Let's all keep safe and look after each other.

Is Palm Sunday. The Gospel is the reading of the passion according to St Matthew. Once again, we hope to deliver resources and a palm to all homes in the village.

The Pope on Confession

"I know that many of you go to confession before Easter ... many will say to me: 'But Father I cannot leave the house and I want to make my peace with the Lord. I want Him to embrace me How can I do that unless I find a priest?' Do what the catechism says. It is very clear. If you don't find a priest to go to confession, speak to God. He is your Father. Tell Him the truth: 'Lord, I did this and this and this. Pardon me.' Ask His forgiveness with all your heart with an act of contrition, and promise Him, 'afterward I will go to confession.' You will return to God's grace immediately. You yourself can draw near, as the catechism teaches us, to God's forgiveness, without having a priest at hand."
