Now that Mass has restarted, few people come to pray on a Saturday afternoon. The church is open and Confessions are available from 4.30pm.

### Coming to St Peter's to Mass

+ Do not come to Mass if you are unwell, self-isolating or shielding or returning from a country where you have to shield

#### + You should wear a face covering

- + Observe the one way system
- + Observe social distancing
- + Any printed materials you touch (Newsletters etc) place in a bin or take home with you.
- + You may wish to come to a weekday Mass instead of on Saturday or Sunday. This will fulfill your Sunday obligation.

*If you are driving, you will need to buzz security at the white gates. The Lodge entrance is closed.*

### Today

Is the 19<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time. In the gospel Peter tries to imitate Jesus by walking on the water. Today is the day of prayer for Europe.

### Weekday Mass

Weekday Masses take place in St Peter's on **Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday** and **Friday** at 8am. We are getting an average of 10 people coming to the weekday Mass.

### Feasts in the week

On Friday we celebrate the feast of St Maximilian Kolbe, a Polish priest who gave his life in a concentration camp so that another prisoner might be spared.

### Next Sunday

The readings of the Sunday are replaced by those of the feast of the Assumption of Mary into heaven.
