Mass will take place on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday at 8am in St Peter's.

Coming to St Peter's for Mass:

Even as we come out of lockdown, it is important to stick to the following guidelines:

- + Do not come to church if you are unwell, self-Isolating, shielding or returning from a country where you have to quarantine
- + You should wear a face covering
- + Sanitise your hands on the way in and way out
- + Observe the one way system
- + Observe social distancing make sure there are
 2 empty benches between you and anyone else
 in the Church and away from the centre aisle.
- + Any printed materials you touch (Newsletters etc) place in a bin or take home with you.
- + Observe social distancing as you come into church, as you come forward for communion and, very importantly as you leave the church. We have to assume that someone is carrying the virus and take precautions.

If you are driving, you will need to buzz security at the white gates.

This Sunday

Is the 3rd Sunday of Easter. In the gospel Jesus appears once more to the disciples and opens their hearts so that they can understand the scriptures.

Next Sunday

Is the 4th Sunday of Easter, also known as "Good Shepherd Sunday". In the gospel, Jesus is described as the one who looks after his sheep. There will be two baskets on the way out of church as there is a second collection for the training of new priests.

Pupils from SMH and Stonyhurst are back already after their Easter break. St Joseph's pupils return on Monday. Let us keep all of these children in our prayers. They have much to catch up on.
