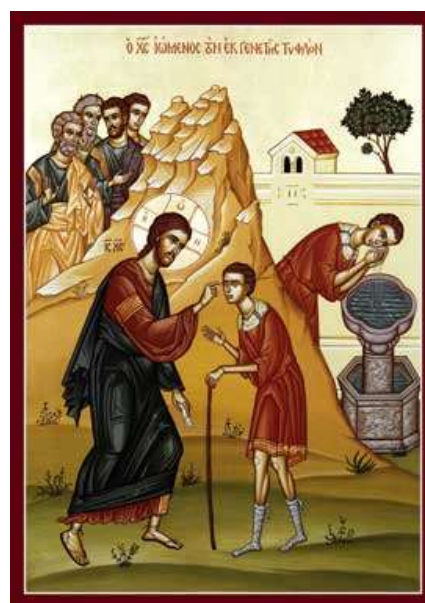

# Corona Virus Latest

## St Peter's and St Joseph's emergency procedures

All public Masses are suspended until further notice  
The bishops have asked that our churches become places of prayer:

St Peter's will be open daily from 7am to 6pm

St Joseph's will be open on a Sunday from 9am to 10.30am

Daily and weekend prayer sheets will be available to those who come to pray.

(After using one of these sheets – please place it in the recycle bin)

(On entering and leaving the church/chapel – please use the hand gel)

People who are over 70, who have special health needs and who are self-isolating **should not** come to church but should stay at home.

## Fr Tim's availability

There will be Exposition and confession every Saturday from 4.30pm to 5.30pm

There will be no benediction, but a simple blessing at the end.

For those who would normally come to the vigil; and Sunday Masses there will be:

A missalette, a newsletter, some bidding prayers and a printed reflection to help you

The church will close at 6.30 on Saturday

Fr Tim will be in St Joseph's on a Sunday from 9am to 10.30

He will be in St Peter's from 11am to 12 Noon

From Tuesday to Friday, Fr Tim will be in St Peter's from 8am to 9am and available on the parish number from 9am to 10am.

At other times, leave a message on the parish answer machine, which will be responded too as soon as possible.

A daily prayer sheet will be available in St Peter's

## Regular activities are suspended:

The 1<sup>st</sup> communion programme will resume in the Autumn

The RCIA programme is almost completed, but it is not clear when our 6 candidates can be received into the church.

Baptisms will be postponed

The housebound will not be able to receive communion during this period

Marriages may take place, but with reduced numbers. Couples may decide to postpone their marriage until after the crisis is over.

Funerals may take place but at the graveside/crematorium only. Again with reduced numbers.

Memorial Masses will be held after the crisis is over.

Other parish activities (Hope in the Future, Ignatian Habit, etc are suspended)
