Pope Francis at COP26

Like the Queen, Pope Francis was intending to come to COP26 in Glasgow this weekend. Now, however, he will send Vatican Secretary of State Cardinal Pietro Parolin to represent him. He did take part in a pre COP26 meeting in the Vatican on 4th October:

'Pope Francis met alongside other religious leaders and scientists from around the world in the Vatican on Monday 4th October, to take a common stand for the protection of the environment, ahead of the UN Climate Change Conference scheduled for 1 – 12 November in Glasgow, Scotland.

The day-long meeting themed: "Faith and Science: Towards COP26" is a Vatican initiative born of a proposal of the embassies of Great Britain and Italy to the Holy See. It developed through monthly virtual meetings that began earlier this year, in which religious leaders and scientists were able to share their concerns and wishes for greater responsibility for the planet and for necessary change.

The Pope and the participants also presented a joint declaration to Alok Sharma, the president-designate of the COP26 climate summit, and to Luigi di Maio, Italian minister for foreign affairs. In his address to the participants at the meeting, Pope Francis expressed gratitude for their presence which shows a "desire for a deepened dialogue among ourselves and with scientific experts" and proposed three concepts to guide their reflection: openness to interdependence and sharing, the dynamism of love, and the call to respect.'

The Pope added that he hoped a dynamism of love would lead to hope and to mutual respect: "in this way we can care for our common home."
